The Out-of-Home Care Co-Ordinator is appointed by Nagle College and is responsible to the Deputy Principal Students.

The Out-of-Home Care Co-Ordinator is co-responsible for developing Catholic identity and educational mission and Catholic Social Teaching of Nagle College within the Mission of the Church.

At Nagle College, we have two key Leadership Teams – the Executive Strategic Leadership Team which consists of the Principal team and the Middle Leadership Team which consists of the POL team.

The Out-of-Home Care Co-Ordinator ensures the successful care of any students that are currently classified or at risk of being classified as Out-of-Home. This person will be the point of contact for these vulnerable students, as well as being key to facilitating the support required and the administration needed for this goal.

As a member of the Middle Leadership Team, they are part of the engine room that makes strategy become successful practice. This is achieved through their collaboration with a range of external agencies, the Deputy Principal Students and House Leaders.
