Success as a Goal: *Success in learning and the importance of working with staff to help you achieve your dreams*

This term is all about students discovering what they are enjoying learning at school and making some decisions about classes for next year. Nagle College provides a series of opportunities for students and parents to participate in this process and become familiar with options. Our aim is to enable students and families to source the information they need to make the best decisions for their child's future educational program. A great place to start is with teachers. Pathways and Pastoral teachers as well as Classroom teachers can help students carve their individual educational pathway.

Starting with success as a goal sets the tone for a fulfilling learning journey. It's not just about achieving a specific outcome but embracing the process of growth and development during the learning in classes. Working with teachers is pivotal in navigating this path to success. Classroom teachers offer guidance, expertise, and a supportive environment essential for realising potential. Students will have the opportunity to look at goals and career aspirations in their Pathways classes during Term 2. Collaboration with teachers fosters a dynamic exchange of knowledge and ideas, opening up options and propelling students towards their goals. The mentorship of teachers provides a supportive environment as they can give invaluable insight into the benefits of studying various subjects. Teachers can explain the content of their subjects and show students how to learn, nurturing skills and confidence. Subject Selections: Making wise choices

It is important students continue to develop and refine their skills as learners so they can manage their chosen studies to the best of their ability. Choosing a course based on current friendship groups is not always successful as all students have different interests and abilities. A student's previous experience in an area of study or related field of interest, should be taken into consideration when selecting a program of study.

When choosing subjects, the student should ask three questions:


1. **Which subjects do I enjoy most?**
2. **Which subjects do I do well in?**
3. **Which subjects interest me?**

Students should contact teachers and seek information about courses or subjects that interest them. Students can seek information from Pathways and subject teachers or the Careers and Pathways coordinator, Ms Louise Kelly. The online Curriculum Handbook provides a link advising the relevant teacher to consult.

As always, Nagle College looks forward to working with students and parents throughout this process to ensure information is shared and sound decisions are made. I encourage you to be in contact and participate in the process.

There is no need to return any forms or money to school.

Unique image codes will be issued to all students on/after photo day so families can register online to view images when they become available in the webshop.

Registration is simple, just follow the 3 simple steps on your child's personalised flyer once you receive it and remember to add the codes for all your children attending this school.

Even if you registered last year, it's important that you do again this year using your child's 2024 image code to link their images for the current year with your contact details.

When images are ready to view and in the webshop, all parents who have registered will be notified by SMS and email.

Once registered, please wait for notification that 2024 images are online to view before making your purchase.
